Passenger Volume during Golden Week 2025

(Tokaido Shinkansen and conventional lines: 12 days from April 25 to May 6)

1. Overview

Regarding train operations for 12 days from April 25 to May 6 during the Golden Week period of FY2025, Shinkansen trains experienced delays due to a collision accident in the JR West area on April 28 and a power equipment inspection following the power outage on April 30. Conventional lines performed generally smoothly.

The total passenger volume of the Shinkansen and limited express trains on the conventional lines was 4,377,000 and 178,000 during the period, respectively, and the total combined passenger volume of the Shinkansen and conventional lines was 4,554,000.

For outbound lines, the highest number of passengers was recorded on May 3 (Sat.) on both the Shinkansen and conventional lines. For inbound lines, it was recorded on May 6 (Tue.) on the Shinkansen line and on May 5 (Mon.) on the conventional lines.
